Session: Improving students' interactive speaking skills

Aimed at: Junior and senior high school English teachers

Background: The new course of study calls for students to learn interactive speaking (やりとり) and many

learners and their parents see the ability to communicate interactively as the most desirable outcome of foreign language learning. This session will give practical ideas for teaching and

assessing interactive speaking.

Learning aims: Teachers will learn how to:

model and manage interactive speaking tasks

• give feedback to help students improve

• rate students' interactive speaking proficiency through performance assessments.

Aimed at: Junior and senior high school English teachers

Background: Reading is core to success in English as a school subject. In the real world too, being able

to read in a foreign language opens up many new opportunities. This session will help teachers understand the different strands of reading proficiency and how to teach them in

the Junior High School classroom.

Learning aims: Teachers will learn how to:

model fluent, expressive reading for students

help students to recognize and read words more fluently

 scaffold students understanding and help them think about and discuss the texts they read.

· understand the role of intrinsic motivation in productive tasks

 use formative feedback to improve students' ability to express themselves and give them a sense of progress.

Session: Teaching writing

Aimed at: Junior and senior high school English teachers

Background: According to the new Course of Study, students should learn how to write for a clear purpose

in a clear setting. This session will look at a typical textbook writing task and show how to

support all students so that they can complete the task.

Learning aims: Teachers will:

 learn how to scaffold writing tasks so that most students in the class can successfully write a connected text

learn techniques for improving the quality and accuracy of students' writing

help students to express their own ideas and opinions through writing.
